Ten Years Dreaming
Cindy Baker with Scott Smallwood
June 5 - August 2, 2025

Opening Reception: Friday June 6, 5 - 7 PM
Performance: Saturday June 7, beginning at 2PM

Cindy Baker has spent ten years dreaming and recording her dreams.

Even in sleep, Baker's activities centre around the artworld and are tinged with chagrin. In her artwork Dream Come True, she recalls dreaming of a plastic coin imprinted with the image of a cartoon duck she purchased on layaway from a commercial gallery: "I went to pick it up and pay for it, and it

was \$10. I wondered why I hadn't been able to pay that amount years ago but realized that we didn't have PayPal that long ago, and that I'd never carry that kind of cash."

Baker animates objects and scenarios first glimpsed in her dreams with sound, electronics and performance. Banal yet unworldly objects—ranging from a sink overflowing with ropes of jewels to an enormous inflatable duck-shaped chair—are accompanied by a ticker board spelling out the contents of Baker's dream journal and a continuous and evolving tapestry of voices created in collaboration with Scott Smallwood.

Sound, intangible and elusive, is an analogue for the exhibition's themes.

Things I've Forgotten is based on Baker's childhood memories of abduction and includes an endurance performance in which Baker pedals an adult-sized Big Wheel tricycle to power a speaker. Baker explains that pushing her body to its limits serves to exorcise long-buried trauma.

Things I've Forgotten requires the artist to continually spin her wheels to power the dream soundtrack, never advancing beyond trauma. Like Baker's use of the cutesy signifiers of childhood, dreams are absurd, disarming and unsettling.

Who is more powerless or more free than the child or the dreamer?

The AGR is pleased to host a comprehensive overview of performance-based and digital artworks by married artists Theo Pelmus and Kristin Snowbird exploring themes of intimacy, land relationships, spirituality, and resilience during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Their work mixes signifiers of their backgrounds and roots of their shared artistic practice, fostering intercultural understanding. They use digital and ephemeral media to

reinvent artistic traditions, revealing how traditional forms were once innovative and how we can reinvigorate cultural artefacts of the past through emerging technologies, for instance using artificial intelligence to proliferate voices speaking traditional Indigenous languages.

Primarily working in performance for film and video, the couple has created work that both underscores social harms and promotes healing. Their video *The Kiss* features the couple embracing on the Red River while wearing masks adorned with sharp quills and needles, symbolizing new rituals for understanding contemporary challenges. Snowbird, a former competitive fancy shawl and jingle dress dancer, performs an endurance piece integrating traditional healing dance elements on top of Garbage Hill.

# SUBMISSIONS NOW OPEN!

The Outside the Box exhibition series is a **non-juried** program that provides opportunities for **AGR members** to display and sell their artwork. Outside the Box shows are ideal professional development opportunities for emerging artists and those looking for a small public venue.

We have two options for display:

#### **HALLWAY GALLERY**

The hallway gallery features 30 running feet of wall display space directly outside the main gallery, and is ideal for 2-D works, like paintings or framed works.

#### **GLASS DISPLAY CASE**

The glass display case is a locked cabinet measuring 52"h x 45"w x 21"d suitable for small scale 2D & 3D artwork, including jewellery, ceramics, small sculpture, and small framed paintings and drawings.

Artist fees are **not paid** for these non-curated exhibitions, instead the AGR facilitates sales on behalf of artists for a **30% commission**, for which the artist receives a charitable donation receipt for use on their tax return.

#### **Proposals should:**

- Describe the work you wish to show (including subject matter, media, size, and number of pieces available)
- 2. Indicate whether you are applying for the Hallway or Display Case
- 3. include a maximum of 3 digital images of your work (does not have to be the work for the exhibition).

Exhibitions are allocated to AGR members on a first-come, first-served basis.




#### THANK YOU SaskTel!
