If You Prick Me, Do I Not Bleed?

Through needle-based practices ranging from embroidery to beading and quilting to tattooing, five Saskatchewan artists invite audiences to share in experiences of otherness, pain, and healing. Rather than inflicting harm, artists in the exhibition use needles to draw together and mend.

Cultural tattooist Stacey Fayant invites viewers to understand traditional practices in her work, consisting of a quilt printed with images of smiling women all bearing chin tattoos, photographs and performing a skin stitch tattoo on her daughter. Her works draws an extended community into this vital celebration and caring.

Métis textile artist Melanie Monique Rose combines powerful symbols of identity - traditional Métis floral beadwork and Palestinian Keffiyeh scarves – to highlight the parallel between her family's experiences of being colonized in Canada and her sister-in-law's experience of colonization in Palestine.

Mindy Yan Miller reminds us to keep the Holocaust in public memory through her nearly immaterial work: a Star of David embroidered in human hair, a recording of the artist whispering

600 names of the six million people who were murdered, and a small pile of chalk dust created by writing and erasing these names. The terrible scantness of the chalk dust, so like cremated ash, allows us to understand the loss of so many lives.

Marcy Friesen (Swampy Cree/Welsh) translates her successful commercial beadwork practice to emotionally-charged photography. During the lengthy process of applying the beads in a pattern of flowing tears, Friesen told her daughter about familial experiences of residential school. Friesen's is a powerful acknowledgement of harms perpetrated on Indigenous Canadians, and offers a profound gesture of healing through traditional knowledge and forms.

Self-taught quilter Hanna Yokozawa Farqharson imagines the lunar seas, dark craters mistaken for bodies of water by early astronomers, as teeming with intelligent cetacean life. The fragile and fanciful work reveals a concern about climate change driving many species from their traditional range, causing the artist to imagine whales seeking refuge on the icy sphere of the moon.

Through their stitches, artists in the exhibition mend and heal relationships with the past, the self, others, and the environment, shaping a resilient social fabric.



The Semiotics of Leisure


Leisure is, essentially, anticapitalistic. It is anti-work; it does not create value. While often dismissed in the larger society as a mere pleasurable diversion, art institutions often put art to work, its job being to educate about societal ills. The Semiotics of Leisure promotes the subversive qualities of pleasure for artists and viewers. This exhibition responds to a surprising well-spring of artists concerned with activities encoded as "free time" or "non-work."

Terri Fidelak's minimalist cube sculpture constructed of layer upon layer of completed picture puzzles is encoded with endless hours of time filling putting together banal images. Aimless directions to an after-hours club unfold in Simon Fuh's dimly lit room quaking with muffled dance beats. While clubbing represents one type of aspirational non-work, both the dedicated act of painting that comprises Gerald Jessop's studio practice and his favoured subject - beach frolickers and their recreational accoutrements - represent avenues of escape from the predictable rhythms of Capitalism.



Live Skin-Stitch Tattooing Event with Stacey Fayant DATE Saturday, March 16th, 2024

Artist Stacey Fayant will conduct a live skin-stitch tattooing performance in conjunction with the exhibition *If You Prick Me, Do I Not Bleed?* inviting family, community, and the public to undertstand Indigenous Cultural Tattooing traditions as acts of healing and care.

Fayant will bestow traditional marks on her daughter in accordance with safety guidelines and traditional protocols.

The event aims to heal historical rifts for Indigenous people and shift attitudes about tattoos. The artist notes that tattooing was traditionally a community event, and invites the public to acknowledge the emotional, spiritual, and physical vulnerability of the artist and her daughter. The event is free and open to all interested people, and includes an intercultural panel discussion of traditional tattooing practices with local and international tattooists.

Traditional Cultural Marks: A Panel Discussion
